# Non-Destructive Testing (NDT) Apprenticeships Assessor's Competency Declaration and Job Description

## Job Description

Because non-destructive testing is considered to be a highly-specialised engineering profession and is inextricably linked to international standards, UKAS accreditation, Engineering Council registration and certification, it is considered that the independent assessment organisation assessors should have extensive knowledge of NDT.

The independent assessment organisation will constitute an assessment panel, which will include two Engineering Council registrants at Incorporated Engineer (IEng) level or above, who are trained professional review interviewers. The independent assessment organisation assessment panel will not include anyone involved in an active apprenticeship from the same company or one of its subsidiaries or from the employing organisation or training providers.
One of the two assessors/interviewers will be identified as the lead assessor. In the event that the two assessors do not agree on the outcome of the assessment, the lead assessor will have the final say.

## Statement of Competency
