Governance

A management committee, elected by members at the ISCM Annual General Meeting, will be responsible for ensuring that the ISCM pursues its aims effectively.

A report to members will be published annually. This will include information on the past year's activities as well as plans for the future. Members will be encouraged to contribute to the strategic direction of the Society.

Administration
